2. **Description of discipline:**

The introduction of such a scientific discipline as History and culture of Kyrgyzstan in the list of compulsory subjects taught to students meets the general requirements of the Ministry of Education of the Kyrgyz Republic. It is designed to facilitate the understanding of the peculiarities of the historical development of the Kyrgyz Republic, including economic, political and cultural aspects, which allows students to integrate more quickly and organically into the local environment, more successfully apply their knowledge in practice and learn new knowledge in the learning process. Additional understanding of the development of society and the basic laws of history has traditionally been a part of any education, regardless of the direction of study and specialization. On the example of the great physicians of antiquity, students understand the need to strive for encyclopedic knowledge in all spheres of modern life in order to carry out deeper research in their field.

The purpose and objectives of the discipline

The main purpose of teaching this discipline is to provide students with knowledge about the main stages of History and culture of Kyrgyzstan from ancient times to the present day. And also to give students general theoretical knowledge about the methodology of studying history, which include the principles of historicism, the influence of the natural environment, social and economic factors, a civilizational approach and other methods. In addition, to provide students with an example of the history of the peoples who inhabited the territory of our country and the Kyrgyz people themselves about important historical dates, events and personalities that influenced the history of the Kyrgyz Republic.

Main goals: at the end of this course, students should have knowledge of the following.

- Main historical dates, events and personalities in national history.
- The basic principles of historical research and related sciences;
- Concepts of the socio-political development of the nomadic peoples of the Eurasian steppes;
- Features of the material and spiritual culture of the Kyrgyz from ancient times to modernity;
- Development of modern society and culture in our country.
- At the end of this course, students **should have skills in following:**
- The ability to see historical processes and events in all their diversity interconnections and interdependencies;
- Ability to work independently with historical literature in order to possess skills of comparative analysis of various historical events and facts;
- The development of their own qualities of an intellectual personality, the ability of analytical thinking and the expansion of erudition.

The place of discipline in the structure of the BEP (prerequisites, postrequisites) –

The discipline "History and culture of Kyrgyzstan" refers to the basic part of the disciplines of the humanitarian, social and economic cycle of the BEP training specialists in the direction of "Medicine". It is an ideological and scientific-methodological basis for the study of humanitarian and socio-economic disciplines.

Prerequisites: Kyrgyz language and literature, history of Kyrgyzstan (basic course)

Post requisites: Philosophy, history of medicine, manas studies.
