2. Description of discipline:

To develop speech activity (reading, listening, writing, speaking) of foreign students in Kyrgyz according to the A1 level of language communication depending on the situation, to use the acquired knowledge and skills in life, to form communication. To introduce Kyrgyzstan and the Kyrgyz people, to strengthen friendly and cooperative relations, to spread tolerant views.

The purpose and objectives of the discipline

The purpose of the practical component is to form the ability to speak and write in Kyrgyz through a practical course of the Kyrgyz language and to achieve the ability to apply the acquired knowledge in life situations.

The objectives of the lesson:

- Along with learning the grammar of the language in the program, practice speaking, reading and writing in Kyrgyz at the A1 level;
- Expanding students' vocabulary through working with small texts (reading, writing, listening, speaking);
- Acquaintance with linguistic materials through assimilation (geography, specialization, etc.) and acquiring information skills.

Main goals: at the end of this course, students

Development of language competence:

- Mastering the rules of grammar, syntax and vocabulary of the Kyrgyz language.
- Development of oral and written communication skills.

Understanding literature:

- Familiarization with classical and modern works of Kyrgyz literature.
- Analysis of literary genres, styles and themes.

Formation of cultural identity:

- Studying national traditions, customs and history through the prism of language and literature.
- Formation of respect for the cultural heritage of Kyrgyzstan.

Development of critical thinking:

- Ability to analyze texts and express one's own opinion about what one has read.
- Formation of skills for independent interpretation of works of art.

Preparation for practical use of the language:

- Application of acquired knowledge in various life situations.
- Ability to use the Kyrgyz language in professional activities.

The place of discipline in the structure of the BEP (prerequisites, postrequisites) –

The discipline " Kyrgyz language and literature " refers to the basic part of the disciplines of the humanitarian, social and economic cycle of the BEP training specialists in the direction of "Medicine". It is an ideological and scientific-methodological basis for the study of humanitarian and socio-economic disciplines.

Prerequisites: Introduction to the Kyrgyz language

Post requisites: Kyrgyz language. A1 level
