2. Description of discipline:

The program is focused on teaching foreign citizens who have not previously studied Russian or who speak Russian in an insufficient volume. This course will provide foreign citizens with the necessary language base:

- for their speedy adaptation in the new social and cultural environment;
- to communicate with native speakers of the Russian language;
- to carry out professional activities in teams, in hospitals where Russian is the working language;
- to communicate with patients during training practices;

Studying the Russian language according to this program will help foreign citizens to master the Russian language at a level that allows them to satisfy their basic communication needs in the field of everyday communication, social, cultural and professional spheres of communication. The content of the program reflects the main levels of the language necessary for mastering communication skills (phonetic, lexical-semantic, grammatical).

The purpose and objectives of the discipline

The purpose of studying the discipline Russian language is to provide foreign students with linguistic knowledge, skills and abilities in various types of speech activities necessary to prepare for clinical practice in Russian and to get acquainted with the culture of Kyrgyzstan. Also to assist in the formation of students' language and speech competence in the amount necessary for communication in the social, cultural and educational spheres. To create the conditions for adaptation and comfortable stay of students at the university and in the country as a whole.

Main goals: at the end of this course, students should have knowledge of the following.

- to form grammatical and linguistic competence (possession of linguistic material in an amount sufficient for free communication in social and cultural situations);
- to form sociolinguistic competence (the ability to use language units in accordance with social, cultural and educational situations of communication);
- to prepare students for clinical practice in Russian;
- to prepare students for life and study in the Russian language environment;
- to prepare students for understanding and perception of the values of the national culture.

The place of discipline in the structure of the BEP (prerequisites, postrequisites) –

This discipline is studied by students of the specialty General Medicine (for foreign citizens) and is included in the list of compulsory disciplines of the humanitarian, social and economic cycle of the State Educational Standard of Higher Professional Education. The discipline program is designed for students who do not speak Russian. The discipline is an integral part of the training program for medical specialists, the mastering of which is designed for 2 semesters of study by foreign students.

The knowledge gained in the course of studying the discipline "Russian language" will be necessary for students to adapt to the new socio-cultural environment; communication with native speakers of the Russian language; carrying out professional activities in teams, in hospitals where Russian is the working language; communication with patients and patients during educational practices.

Competencies of students, formed as a result of mastering the discipline, planned results of mastering the academic discipline.

- IC-3 capable and ready for written and oral communication in the state language and official languages, capable of speaking one of the foreign languages for solving professional problems.
- **SPC 5** is capable and ready for logical and reasoned analysis, for public speech, discussion and polemics, for the implementation of educational and academic activities, for cooperation.

As a result of mastering the discipline, the student must demonstrate the following results of developing the academic discipline:

After mastering this discipline, the student:

- will know the phonetic and intonation means of the Russian language, the basic derivational, morphological and syntactic units and the conditions for their use;
- will understand the basic information (topic, indication of place, time, reason, etc.) presented in individual dialogues and monologues of a social and medical nature;
- will be able to use basic medical terminology in Russian;
- will be able to initiate a dialogue in typical communication situations (meeting, farewell, doctor-patient dialogue, doctor-medical staff, etc.). Write a short letter, note, congratulations, etc. Request or report information about a fact or event, the subject and number of objects, time, reasons for the action and event, the possibility / impossibility of their implementation. Express your attitude, evaluate a person, object, fact, event.
- Will be able to own the minimum lexical volume not less than 1300 units;
- will be able to read short simple texts taken from different sources (names of magazines and newspapers, signs, inscriptions, signs, advertisements, etc.), understand the basic and additional information of adapted texts of a social, medical nature, present the main content of the text source based on the questions; build own statement based on the text read.
